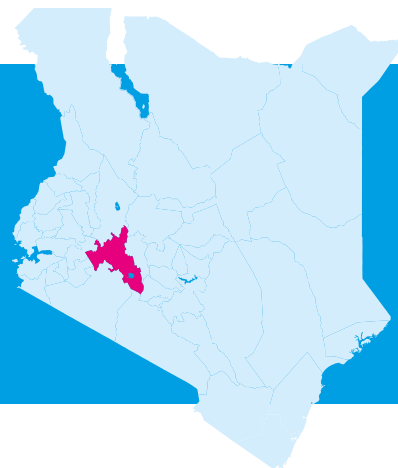

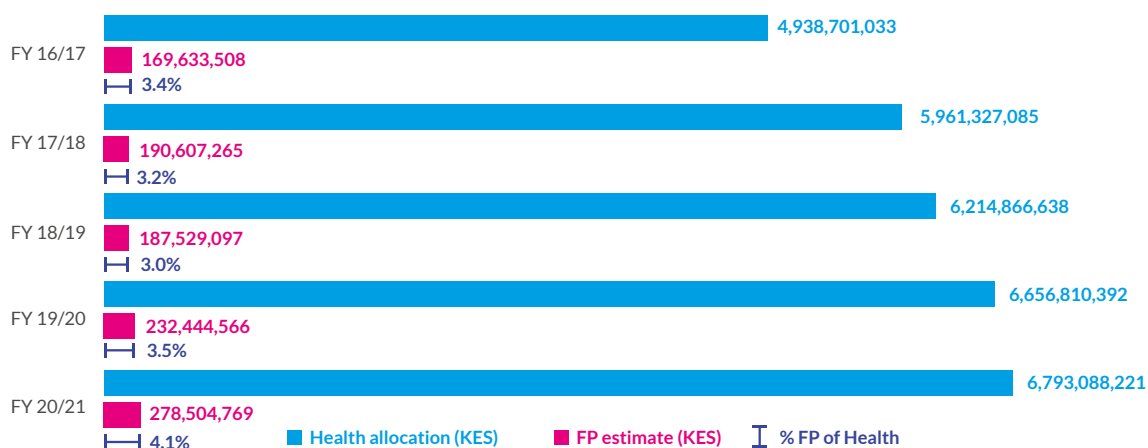
## Family planning budget analysis

2020/21



## FAMILY PLANNING BUDGET ESTIMATE

The budget analysis conducted in October 2020 revealed that the **County Government of Nakuru does not have a budget line for family planning** for FY 2020/2021. However, indirect family planning allocation\* by the County Government of Nakuru was estimated for the period 2016/2017 to 2020/2021 as follows:



The estimates were informed by the following documents: Kenya Health Policy (KHP)2014-2030; Kenya Health Sector Strategic Plan (KHSSP) 2018-2022; Economic Survey(various years); Medium Term Plan (MTP)2018 -22; Budget Outlook Paper (BOPA); Medium Term Expenditure Frameworks (MTEFs); Ministerial Performance Reviews (MPRs); Documents from Commission of revenue allocation (CRA) on approve county allocations; County FP Costed Implementation Plan; County Integrated Development Plans; Kenya Population and Housing Census(KPHC) 2019; and County budget.

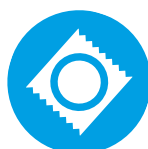
\*Indirect allocation for family planning by County Governments was estimated per county based on workload statistics from the District Health Information System (DHIS) and subjected to county allocation to health. For FY 2019/20, the service utilization statistics and thus the rates used were recorded based on the average change between the preceding period. Then the weights were used to derive possible allocations for family planning.

## POLICY BASIS FOR FAMILY PLANNING BUDGET INVESTMENT

The County Government of Nakuru has two key policy documents that guide investment decisions about family planning for the county:

**a. Nakuru County Integrated Development Plan (CIDP) 2018-2022**

- Nakuru County, through the Nakuru County integrated development Plan (CIDP) 2018-2022, commits to provide access to family planning services and contraceptives to residents as a strategy to promote "the health of women and children".

**b. Nakuru County Family Planning Costed Implementation Plan 2016-2021**

- Nakuru County, through the Nakuru County family planning, costed implementation plan (2016 - 2020) estimates that the county needs KES. 48,218,650 million for the county's family planning programme for year four of the plan.

Nakuru County Family Planning Costed Implementation Plan earmarks investing in quality health infrastructure and human resources in all sub-counties. There County will invest in family planning especially for the youth and undertake awareness campaigns on the importance of family planning.



## INTERNATIONAL REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH/FAMILY PLANNING COMMITMENTS (ICPD25 COMMITMENTS)

At the Nairobi Summit on the 25th Anniversary of the International Conference on Population and Development Programme (ICPD), President Uhuru Kenyatta committed to:

- Ensure universal access to friendly quality reproductive health services and information to the youth and adolescents by 2030.
- Gradually increase financing of family planning commodities from domestic resources.
- Eliminate legal, policy, and programmatic barriers that impede youth participation in decision making, planning, and implementation of development activities at all levels by 2030.



## RECOMMENDATIONS

1. The County Government of Nakuru needs continue to honour its commitment of providing access to family planning services and contraceptives to residents as outlined in the County Integrated Development Plan (CIDP) 2018-2022 and the County Family Planning Costed Implementation Plan 2016-2020.
2. The County Government of Nakuru needs to institute policy and budgetary measures to ensure universal access to friendly quality reproductive health services and information to the youth and adolescents by 2030
3. The County Government of Nakuru needs to gradually increase financing of family planning commodities from domestic resources.
4. The County Government of Nakuru needs to eliminate legal, policy and programmatic barriers that impede youth participation in decision making, planning and implementation of development activities at all levels by 2030.
